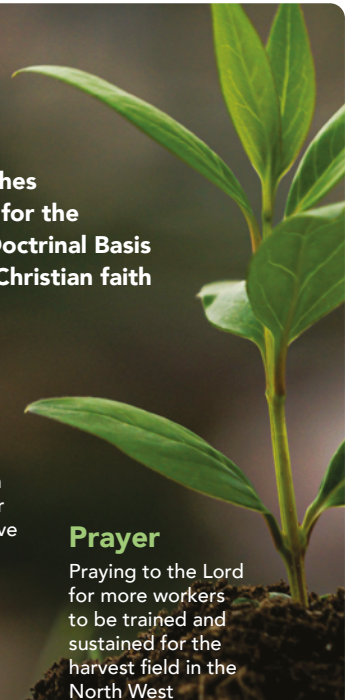

# A New Vision for our Partnership

Train  
& Sustain

*'Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field'. Matthew 9:38*

The NWGP has always placed high value on training gospel workers. Since the ministry training course began over 20 years ago, we have seen many men and women equipped for word ministry. It's a joy to meet people from all over the region and beyond who have been students on the course and who are now serving in local churches both in full-time and part-time roles.

As trustees we have been reflecting on how the NWGP can more effectively serve partner churches as we pray for the Lord of the harvest to be raising up a new generation of gospel workers.

We believe that the Lord is calling us to a renewed focus on training new gospel workers and on sustaining new and existing workers for the long haul of ministry.

Our vision, which was launched at the annual conference back in January, expresses it this way:

***'Local churches partnering together to train and sustain workers for the gospel in the North West'.***

The emphasis on local churches and partnership is important. The responsibility for identifying and recruiting potential workers lies with the leadership of our individual churches. But we also recognise that we need to pool resources to be able to offer the kind of training

that is needed to see people equipped for ministry. We believe that the ministry training course continues to offer a really important complement to the training that happens locally.

It's true that there are more training providers and more routes into ministry than were available even a decade ago. We are certainly not 'the only show in town' and for that, we rejoice. If we're to see even a fraction of the number of workers we need to see the gospel growing and bearing fruit in our region, we need to continue to develop partnerships with other providers.

As well as focusing on training a new generation of workers, we also want to underline the importance of the 'sustain' part of the vision. Gospel ministry is a great privilege, but it also involves enduring hardship, as Paul reminded young Timothy (2 Tim 4:5). As a Partnership we want to continue to be a place where we can offer and receive encouragement: to be hearing God's word together and to be praying with and for one another.

Please do be praying to the Lord of the harvest to be at work across our region. And do get in touch with Ro, our training director, if you would like more details of how you and your church might be involved.

# Train

Training has always been at the heart of what we do as a partnership.

By pooling financial resources that allow us to run the Ministry Training Course (MTC) and other events, all partner churches are contributing to the raising up of future workers for the harvest field, a need that we feel ever more acutely as a region.

## Training Opportunities

The **Ministry Training Course** is still going strong with over 40 on the course this year. Focusing on Bible handling & the Bible overview in the first year, it lays a great foundation for all workers for the gospel in the North West, no matter what their roles in the local church, be they voluntary or paid, teaching a Sunday School class or preaching to a whole congregation. In addition to the MTC, we also have one off courses such as the recent **'Heroes of the Faith'** course on Church History. Churches can host training events at a local level, such as the 8-week **Bible Handling Skills** course recently held in Blackburn. There are options for **one-off Saturday training** sessions: get in touch if you would like to discuss training to suit your local context. The **Children and Youth Leaders Annual Conference** is now well established as a great day to bring your whole team of leaders to: themed around a particular issue, the day always provides valuable training through stimulating talks and practical seminars. **Sound Holidays** also provide an excellent opportunity for raising up the next generation of leaders as we train new leaders and serve alongside each other for a week.

## Hosting as a group of churches

A key challenge facing all churches it seems at this time is the raising of more leaders.

We are certainly feeling that here in Blackburn. It has been an absolute privilege to see people come to faith and churches revitalised. But how do we grow and nurture more local leaders within our churches to join the task of maturing those new disciples and reaching out to the remaining thousands of lost sheep in our town and beyond?

With that aim in mind and with a view to generally better equipping our church family members, four churches in south Blackburn came together to host the NWGP Bible handling course at the beginning of 2026. Over eight evening sessions, Ro led us through the different genres we encounter in the Bible. From narrative to law to prophecy to poetry to gospels to letters to apocalyptic literature, we were equipped to read these genres for ourselves. Ro helped us to see why these genres are written as they are and how God uses them to speak his truth to us. This allowed those attending to avoid the common pitfalls of misunderstanding and begin to read the bible for all its worth in full technicality!

Hosting the course in partnership between our four churches made it much easier to undertake. We found it simplest to gather at one church for all of the sessions but

then took it in turns between church leaders to 'MC' each week. One of the churches also helped organise a bookstall through 10 of those. Church members really got onboard and came along in good numbers including a number from beyond Blackburn as well. It was a delight to see people's eyes light up as they suddenly grasped how to read a particular genre and even a sense of relief as they felt the joy of areas the Bible being unlocked before them. We are definitely seeing the fruit of people feeling the confidence to read all of the bible for themselves. We are praying now for the fruit of local leaders to emerge to serve within our churches. We are also praying that some attending will also decide to join the NWGP ministry training course to be further equipped to serve God's kingdom here at home or even beyond.

Whether as a single church or as a partnership, we would highly recommend the bible handling course to you. We are so glad we decided to do so. I know Ro and the team are more than happy to discuss how the course can best fit and tailor to the needs of your church and town.

# Catching up with MTC Alumni



## Adam Wilson

I currently serve as the minister of Christ Presbyterian Church in Pocklington, a church plant of the International Presbyterian Church. I am married to Genevieve, who also did the North West Training Course for two years, and together we have two children.

I had the blessing of starting the Training Course in 2009 while serving as a ministry trainee at Aigburth Community Church in Liverpool. It was great fun piling into the car with other trainees from Christ Church Liverpool and heading to Leyland. We would rehearse the talks we were about to give on the journey there, then spend the return trip talking through how the Bible fits together, debating big theological ideas, and thinking about how to apply it all to the work we're involved in. I think everyone who attended owes a lot to Justin Mote for all he taught us, but I am very grateful to all the pastors and teachers on the course who gave me that initial theological direction and those Bible-handling tools, preparing me for the rest of the week's work in local church ministry, and later to serve as a UCCF Staff Worker in the Midlands.

Looking back, it is clear to see that the training course was an essential part of God's provision that pushed me on in the journey into full-time theological education at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia and eventually full time pastoral ministry. I am very grateful.



## Lucy Boyall

Hello, my name is Lucy and I find it very hard to believe that I completed the first year of the Ministry Training Course, as a fresh faced 22-year-old, 17 years ago.

And bizarrely enough so much and yet so little seems to have changed since then. The 'so much' accounts for almost 15 years of marriage, five children - both biological and adopted - house moves, church changes, job changes, new passions and the loss of loved ones. But as for the 'so little', Christ remains faithful, and we continue to lean hard on Him as a family.

The wonderful truths of God's character and sustaining grace that I was able to explore and dig into during my NWGP Training Course days have become evermore real through the ups and downs of normal life. I may not have chosen to pursue paid ministry or any paid work for that matter, but the opportunity it gave me to have my eyes lifted to my Lord and Saviour has helped me seek to shape my whole life around Him over the years. Practically, the tools I learned for handling God's Word have been immensely helpful and served me well in preparing Bible studies and writing talks.

What a privilege and a joy! It hasn't always felt like that, especially when knee deep in pooey nappies, but I've learned to believe it more. ## GETTING TO KNOW OUR PARTNERS

# HOPE Church, Ashton-in-Makerfield

We are a warm and welcoming church situated in the small town of Ashton-in-Makerfield, midway between Wigan and St Helens.

The church was built in 1882, and we are still in the original building. Our purpose is to share the good news of Jesus with those in our area and to grow more like him as a church family. We meet every Sunday morning and evening. Around 80 people attend the morning service where we are fed by our Pastor's ministry as he takes us systematically through books in the Bible. Junior Church and a crèche operate during the latter part of the service. Refreshments are served afterwards giving us an opportunity to get to know the many new folk who have found us on the web. The service is uploaded to YouTube each Sunday afternoon.

### Our Pastor – Michael Cornall

Michael grew up on a farm near Kirkby Lonsdale and became a Christian when he was a child. He has served as the pastor of Hope Church since 2009. He is married to Holly and they have two children. The driving-force behind Michael's ministry is his desire to see people come to know Jesus Christ and have their lives transformed by him. He is supported by three elders and a strong team of leaders.

### Activities

We have a range of regular activities including a prayer meeting and Bible study, house groups, CAMEO (mother and toddler group), coffee morning and three weekly clubs for children and young people from age 4 years through to mid-twenties.

It is encouraging to see several of our young people getting involved in United Beach Mission. Many of them attend the annual Cumbria Christian Youth Camp either as campers or leaders.

We hold outreach events for ladies, usually involving crafts, cakes or puddings and men's events, often involving football and pizza. We have a church family weekend planned in June.

### Our Mission Statement:

**To Live By Faith** - Trusting in Jesus for salvation by faith and seeking to follow his example and commands in our daily lives.

**To Be Known By Love** - Having received love from God we seek to show love to each other and to our community in Ashton.

**To Be A Voice Of Hope** - We believe that the gospel of Jesus offers lasting hope. Therefore, we seek to share that message with all who don't yet know Him.

### Challenge

Our biggest challenge is a church building that is no longer fit for purpose. Our aim is to build a new church, which is a huge undertaking, and this is supported by the ongoing gifts and prayers of our church family – for God's glory.

## PASSION FOR LIFE MISSION

# St Andrew's Leyland

Growth groups have long been an integral part of church family life at St Andrews, and as they do in most churches, provide an opportunity for more intentional fellowship and spurring one another on as we seek to live for Jesus.

Out of a desire for that fellowship to deepen, and taking our lead from Paul's exhortation to the Philippians to "strive together as one for the faith of the gospel" we decided to turn our Life26 mission over to the Growth Groups.

Rather than host a handful of large invitational events as a whole church, and then encourage church family to invite others along, each Growth Group was asked to plan and run a small evangelistic event for the people they know. Beginning with prayer, and then thinking about who they wanted to share the gospel with, each group came up with a smaller and more intimate occasion in which to share the gospel in a more tailored way.

The resulting mission week consisted of thirteen events. Some of which you might expect, and some I certainly didn't see coming. We had events as simple as one group putting on a Sunday dinner where one of the group shared his testimony. We had another where they ran a full wine tasting evening with a gospel preacher. We had a 'sitting disco' for adults with

learning difficulties, and the event that surprised me most was a history tour of the church building. The biggest event was when two groups joined together to host an evening looking at how Christ speaks into our lives when we are struggling with our mental health. As each group had thought first about who they wanted to reach, they tailored their events to interest those people. And it worked.

By the end of the week there was a real sense of unity and achievement in the growth groups. They had stepped out in faith, laboured together in kingdom work, invited their friends, family, and colleagues; and had a thoroughly good time doing so. There was a real sense of ownership and personal investment in each event. This was born out in the numbers as well. Far more non-Christians got to hear about Jesus than we believe would have accepted an invite to a large event, and most wonderfully, a number of the groups have caught the bug for evangelising together throughout the year.

We'll definitely do missions weeks this way again, and next time we're going to have a deeper think about how our follow up courses (like CE and 321) might also be tailored in the same way.

# GYD Conference

Attending the conference and being in the room with brothers and sisters who share the same heart for children to hear the gospel in a relevant and biblical way is amazing. It is a real encouragement connecting with others who understand both the joy and challenges of children's work. Hearing from different people on how they do things is a really good way to spark ideas for my work in St Mary's Balderstone and is a reminder we're not alone!



The team members that we brought along are new to children's work so for them it was a real eye opener to what is out there in other churches across the NW region, and worshipping together was great. The sessions helped them see both their role in the sessions and also how to help with their own children. I hope they feel valued as team members and can see how we can work together to bring the gospel to every session or interaction we have with children in our church. They are keen to come again next year and we are hoping their enthusiasm will spark others to come too!

To any other teams out there thinking about coming: DO IT! The investment of a day away together both in the travel, the sessions and the chats over breaks hopefully establishes the team and helps us all grow together, being fed by the amazing gospel we get to share."

## SOUND Lunch



Each term we run a training lunch for those involved in children's and youth ministry in our gospel partnership. We gather for mutual support and encouragement with input from a visiting speaker to equip us in our ministries.

Over the last year, we've been helped to think about running effective All Age services, staying spiritually fresh as we serve, how to shepherd children and young people through transitions and milestones at school and into university.

"I have found North West Gospel Partnership Sound Lunch deeply encouraging. Since beginning my role, these gatherings have become a valuable space for fellowship, prayer and mutual support among those serving in youth ministry across different churches and denominations.

On 6th May we had the privilege of hearing from Boaz Williams from UCCF, who spoke about the transition from youth ministry into university life. His talk, grounded in

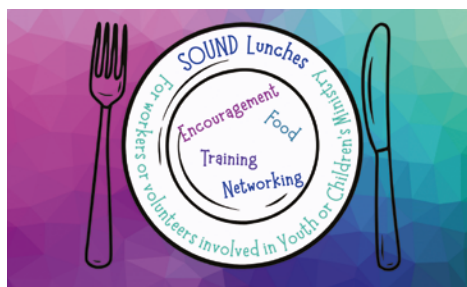
Acts 1:1–11 and Daniel 1:1–8, highlighted how transitions are spiritually significant moments in God's story. Throughout Scripture, God often shapes His people during seasons of change and uncertainty. Daniel remained faithful in Babylon despite being removed from everything familiar, while the disciples in Acts learned to trust God as they waited for the Holy Spirit.

Boaz explored the realities many young people face when leaving for university: moving to a new city, building friendships, finding a church, and facing new pressures and temptations. One testimony that stood out was from a student whose confidence was rooted not in circumstances, but in her identity in Christ.

The session reminded me how important it is to prepare young people not only practically, but spiritually. As churches, we are called to help them stand firm in their faith, remember who they are in Christ, and trust God through every transition of life. Most importantly, we must continually remind them that Jesus goes with them wherever they go. Even in seasons of loneliness, uncertainty or struggle, his love remains constant. University may bring many changes, but the truth of the Gospel never changes: they are deeply loved by Christ, never abandoned and never alone."

## Partnership in Action

For the last two years, my January timetable has included a weekly trip from Bury (where I pastor Radcliffe Road Baptist Church) to St Andrew's Church centre in Leyland where I have taught a four-week class on the Holy Spirit.

This is part of the North West Training Course, and the class I teach is the second year. The students have always been engaged and keen to learn, and the class is very interactive. While Ro Mody is the main teacher, about 50% of the teaching is done by visiting pastors like myself. From my own experience, and hearing second-hand from those on the course, the syllabus is very thorough, and those on the course go away with a good grasp of Scripture and Christian doctrine.

Christian learning is always about more than just "head knowledge". One of the practical aspects of this or any similar course is to create opportunities for those on the course to use their knowledge, for example teaching the material to others. The young men, in particular, may have a

gift for preaching. Our church at Radcliffe Road has a weekly evening service and this has proven to be a great "training ground" for those embarking on a preaching ministry. This year, I made a point of inviting several of the men on the North West training course to preach for us one Sunday evening. So far, two of them have done so, and, to our encouragement, they brought friends with them to support them as they shared God's word. These visits have been hugely encouraging for us as a church. As well as boosting our singing, we have had fellowship with young believers keen to live out their Christian lives and to serve the Lord.

As pastor of a NWGP partner church, I am keen to build our connection with NWGP; sometimes it has been hard to see how to do so with the involvement of the whole congregation, rather than just myself as the pastor. But this has been an opportunity for the church to feel tangibly connected to the Partnership.
